

Lesson Plan



Objectives

- Students will that September 11th, 2001 is continuing to take lives due to illnesses.
 - Students will learn that America's largest water evacuation was on September 11th, 2001.
 - Students will learn that there are many ways to honor and remember people who lost their lives on September 11th, 2001.
 - Students will understand that everyday people acted heroically during America's darkest day and continue to do so.
 - Students will understand that it is important to be an active listener and ask questions to uncover extraordinary, untold stories of heroism that are all around them.
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Materials

- *9/11 Courage and Tributes*, by Kristie Kiernan Bouryal
 - Reading Comprehension Quiz
 - Reading Comprehension Worksheet
 - Draw Your Everyday Hero and Tell Us About That Person
 - Write a Message to First Responders
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Lesson

Students should share what they believe they can do to honor and remember people who passed on September 11, 2001.

Teacher will read aloud the book *9/11 Courage and Tributes*, by Kristie Kiernan Bouryal, with guided questions periodically.

After reading is complete students can answer the extended response questions on the reading comprehension worksheet.

As a wrap up, students can share ways they learned they can honor and remember people who passed on September 11, 2001. Students can also share ways they can help during a crisis, such as a natural disaster or an emergency.

Assessment

Students can take the 10-question multiple choice quiz to check understanding of material.

Lesson Extension

As an extension, students can:

- Draw and share details about their everyday hero, using the template.
- Write a message they would like to share with a first responder, using the template.
